### Breed Spotlight: Macaw

The macaw species can be greatly varied in size. The largest macaws are the hyacinth, Buffon's (great green) and green-winged macaws. The smallest is the red-shouldered macaw, which are the size of some parakeets.

#### Fun Facts

In captivity, some of the different species have been bred together to form hybrids. A couple of examples of hybridized species include the Harlequin (blue and gold bred with a red and green macaw), miligold macaw (blue and gold bred with a military) and the catalina (blue and gold bred with a scarlet macaw).

Some species of macaw around the Amazon Basin eat clay from riverbanks. No definitive reason has been established for this behavior. Some theories say they are eating clay to neutralize toxins consumed while foraging. Another says they consume the clay to increase their sodium content.

#### Appearance

The distinguishing characteristics of macaws are long tails, large beaks in proportion to their head and light-colored facial patches. They vary greatly in color depending on the species. The somewhat "classic" blue and gold macaw has sunshine bright yellow-gold feathers on his chest and on the reverse side of the tail feathers. The back and top of the head have turquoise feathers, giving an interesting and bold contrast.

The hyacinth macaw is known for its deeply hued cobalt blue feathers, yellow accents on the face and a large black beak.

The military macaw has grass-green feathers covering most of its body, wings and tail tipped in turquoise and red feathers blooming around the nose.

With many, many more species, the colors are as varied as one can imagine, each unique, jewel-toned and spectacular!

#### Natural Habitat

Most macaw species can be found in Central America, North America (Mexico), South America and the Caribbean. Most species are endangered in the wild with a few species being extinct. The biggest threat to wild macaw species is wild trapping and destruction of habitat.

In the wild, macaws eat a variety of foods including nuts, seeds, fruit (ripe and unripe) flowers and some insects.



Some species are also known to forage over large distances. This validates the fact that adequate enrichment is essential to help captive macaws duplicate their natural foraging habits.



**Personality**

Macaws are social birds, living in flocks of 10 to 30. They spend the majority of their day in the wild foraging and engaging in social behavior (like preening). They are smart birds that enjoy playing and interacting with different objects they find.

They are described by their owners as having big personalities. Even the small macaws have never really figured out that they are not their larger counterparts. They are vocal birds with large voices to match their flashy colors. In the wild, macaws constantly forage and use their giant beak to break open tough seeds and nuts. Pet macaws need a lot of toys to help keep their beak in tiptop shape. They are not a bird for novice bird owners. Many people are intimidated by their size. However, socialized macaws can make gentle pets.

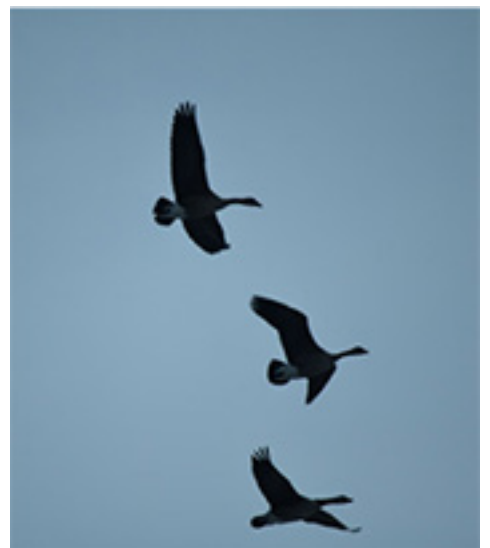
# Spotted On The River Ice Near Montreal, Canada

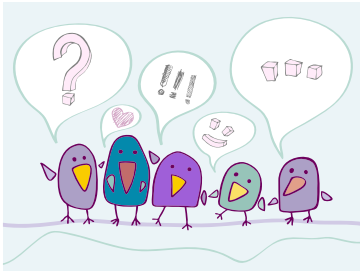
if they want to stay in the frozen north, or join the rest of their flock in the annual migration south to warmer climates. Temperature was 28 degrees F at the time that these photos were taken.

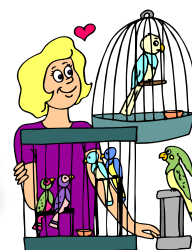
